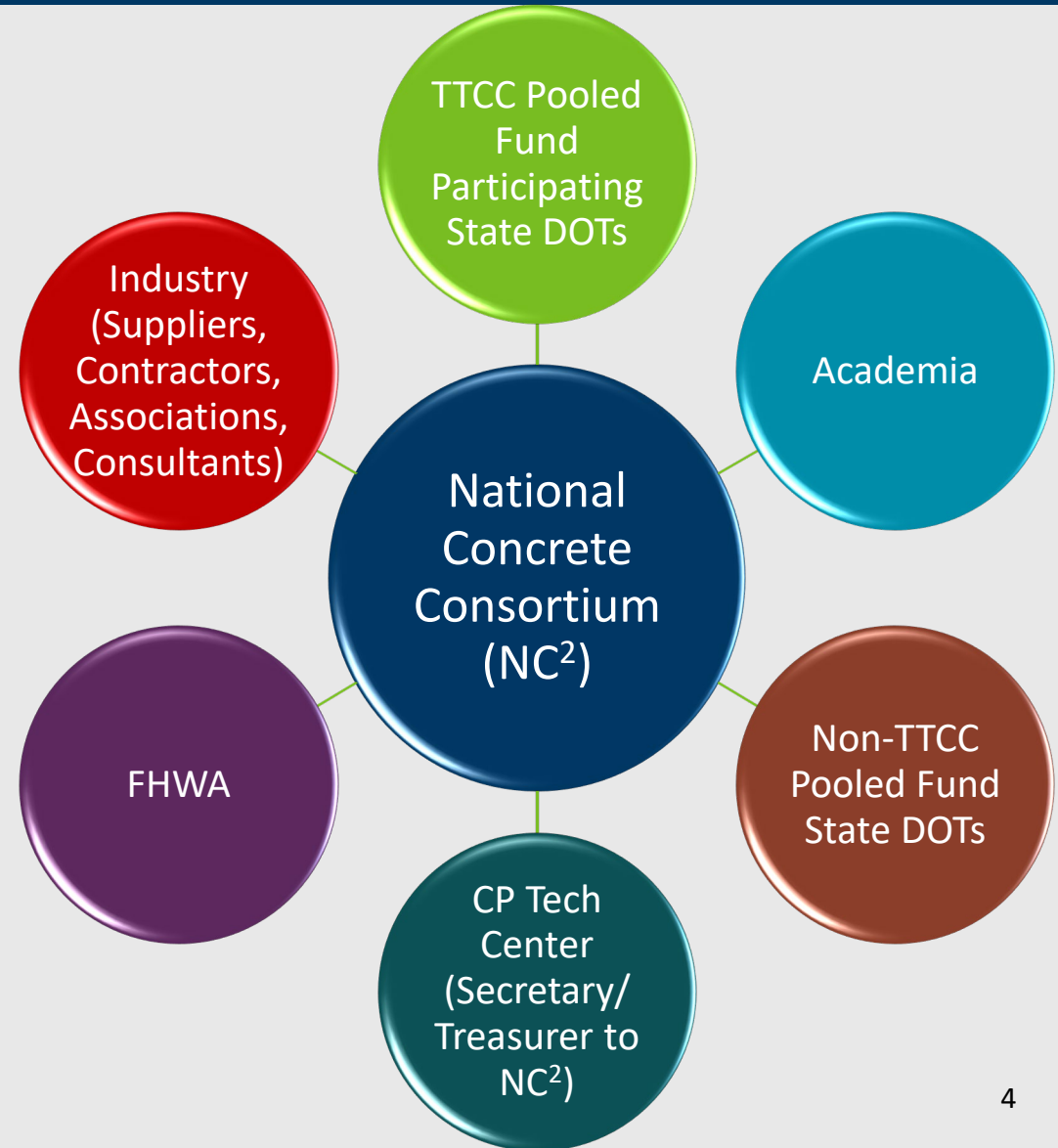

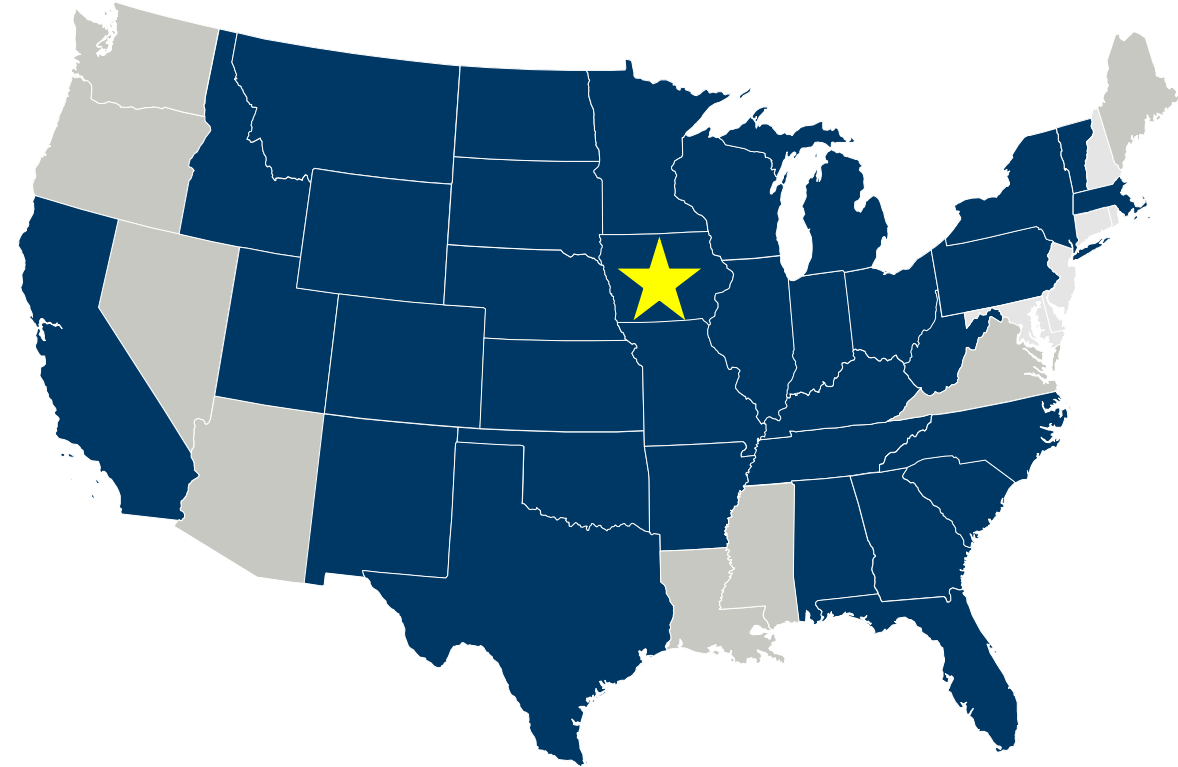
National Concrete Consortium (NC²)

- National forum for concrete research and technology sharing
- Broad national coordination of research, specifications, and implementation
- To promote quality design and construction practices
- Meet two times per year in spring and fall
- NC² provides opportunity for real time support to tap into the resources of other DOTs, Industry and Academia
- Governed by Executive Committee who plans meetings



Technology Transfer Concrete Consortium (TTCC)

- DOT participation supported through FHWA Pooled Funds
 - Currently 34 DOTs and the Illinois Tollway participate as part of TTCC
- TTCC pooled fund provides participating State DOTs workshops, newsletters, small research projects, and MAP briefs which summarize best and current practices

CP Tech Center provides supports to Iowa DOT



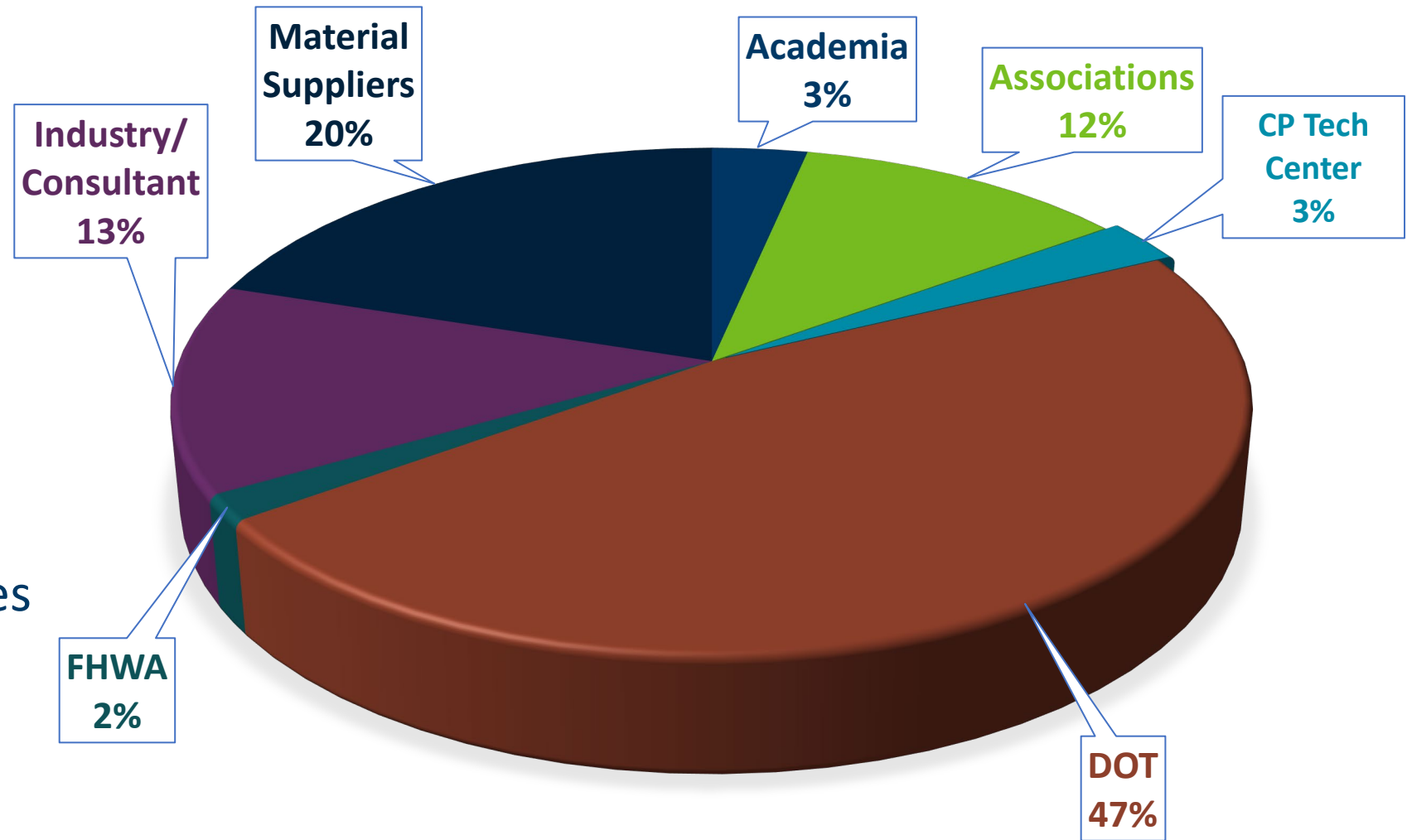
